IMPORTANT DATES IN DECEMBER AA HISTORY

DEC 1934 BILL & LOIS START ATTENDING OXFORD GROUP MEETINGS.

DEC 1934 TO MAY 1935 -BILL WORKS WITH ALCOHOLICS, BUT FAILS TO SOBER ANY OF THEM. LOIS REMINDS HIM HE IS SOBER.

DEC 1938 - TWELVE STEPS WRITTEN.

Nov/Dec 1939 - Akron group withdraws association with Oxford Group.

DEC 1940- 1ST AA GROUP FORMED IN ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI.

DEC 1950 GRAPEVINE ARTICLE SIGNED BY BOTH BILL AND DR BOB RECOMMEND ESTABLISHING AA GENERAL SERVICE CONFERENCE.

DEC 1, 1940 -CHICAGO DAILY TRIBUNE BEGINS A SERIES OF ARTICLES ON AA BY NALL HAMILTON.

DEC 5, 1985 -DAVE B, FOUNDER OF MONTREAL GROUP DIES WEEKS BEFORE 50TH ANNIVERSARY. HIS STORY ADDED TO THE 4TH EDITION BIG BOOK.

DEC 7, 1949- SISTER IGNATIA RECEIVED POVERELLO MEDAL ON BEHALF OF A.A.

DEC 11, 1934- BILL ADMITTED TO TOWNS HOSP 4TH/LAST TIME (FALL '33, '34 IN SUMMER, MIDSUMMER AND FINAL ADMITTANCE).

DEC 12, 1934 -BILL HAS SPIRITUAL EXPERIENCE AT TOWNS HOSPITAL.

DEC 12, 1937 BILL MEETS WITH ROCKEFELLER FOUNDATION AND TRIES TO GET MONEY.

DEC 13 OR 14, 1934 -EBBY VISITED BILL AT HOSPITAL, BROUGHT WILLIAM JAMES'S BOOK, "VARIETIES OF RELIGIOUS EXPERIENCE".

DEC 20, 1945 -ROWLAND H DIES (HE CARRIED THE OXFORD GROUP MESSAGE TO EBBY).

Reflections on being sober for Christmas this year

Last month, I talked about being grateful for being sober at Thanksgiving. Christmas is no different. But when I look back at past Christmas', it had become a major chore, an inconvenience to me. The pressure of trying to find the perfect gifts just made me drink more. Trying to come up gift ideas was harder because my thinking was clouded with alcohol. I knew I would be at parties where alcohol was not part of the menu. I wasted a lot of time coming up with plans on how I would survive and drink.

When I was very young, my grandmother would ask my sister and I if we wanted to go look at Christmas lights on Christmas Eve. We both got excited and said yeah. So we went with grandma looking at Christmas light decorations, just the three of us. We loved looking at those light displays, as they were both beautiful and fascinating. After a while of driving around and looking at lights, we went back home and wouldn't you know we just missed Santa Claus. There were presents under the tree and Santa had eaten our cookies and drank the milk we left out for him.

Throughout my life and while I was still an active drinker, I liked to drive around and look at Christmas light displays.

But this time, I was wondering what the people behind the light displays were doing. Were they having a good time? Did they have peace in their hearts? Were they enjoying each other's company?

I knew in my heart I didn't have any of these any more. It was just another holiday to get through. It was just another holiday in my drinking career.

This will be my second sober Christmas, and the warm feeling of celebration is back in my life. The pressures are not there anymore. A.A. has provided the tools to be of service, be a friend and enjoy my family. I'd rather not be expecting anything, but to give. It is important to give of my time for companionship, laughter and joy. And just maybe do something I'd hesitate to do before but do it for someone else's benefit. A.A. brought back spirituality into my life that makes Christmas all the more meaningful for me. Christmas comes around once a year, but the value of giving and service I can carry on thought the year.

This season, I will drive around and look at Christmas lights, not with my old perspective, but one where I see someone else is trying to share a little hope and a little joy. Now I better go put up my Christmas lights outside. -John G.
