

Acceptance-continued



In December, the topic of 'Acceptance is the Answer' came up in a few meetings. On page 417 is the following, "And acceptance is the answer to all my problems today. When I am disturbed, it is because I find some person, place, thing, or situation—some fact of life—unacceptable to me....." I began to analyze my current and especially past experiences where I ran into this problem. Why, I asked myself, was I having problems accepting these types of things, whatever they may be. And why was I able to accept other problems or situations with no effort. Was it because I had to always be right or that I knew better than another? Was something always interfering with what I wanted? Did I have something to prove? Did I just have to have my way? Did I have to feel like I was in control when everything about me was out of control?

While thinking about this, resentments came into mind for some reason and page 552. "If you have a resentment you want to be free of, if you will pray for the person or thing that you resent, you will be free...." This advice was suggested to me by a long-time member who heard me talking about a resentment I had with my former CEO. I was never going to see this CEO again, but

couldn't let go of the resentment. In his kind voice he asked, "John, have you ever thought about praying for that person?" Per his suggestion, I read page 552 and prayed for that person, and I didn't even realize when the resentment had left. How did that work? I was relieved it worked.

When I thought about this, two things jumped out to me from each of those pages, "unacceptable to me" and resentment. Both of these are generated in my head by me. When I did my fourth step inventory, it became apparent that my number one and number two character defects were selfishness and self-centeredness. So these two character defects still are present, though not as much as they used to be.

A couple of paragraphs from page 62 are read after 'How It Works' at one particular meeting I go to really made sense when I tied the above two actions with my defects. "Selfishness---self-centeredness! That, we think, is the root of our troubles. Driven by a hundred forms of fear, self-delusion, selfseeking, and self pity....So our troubles, we think are basically of our own making...." These two are fuel for my ego and I really cannot afford to have an ego. My ego was self driven, and one way for me to keep it at bay is to pray the Third Step Prayer every morning, where I ask my Higher Power "relieve me of the bondage of self, that I may better do thy will...." When I ask for the bondage of self to be relieved in me, it is hard for fear, self-delusion, self-seeking and selfpity to enter and take over. When I am not thinking of myself, I am able to better serve others and to accept things as they are, not as I would have them. -John G.
