Tradition 8 Checklist

These questions were originally published in the AA Grapevine in conjunction with a series on the Twelve Traditions that began in November 1969 and ran through September 1971. The D18 newsletter committee thought that republishing these questions related to each tradition would help further the growth of individuals and groups in their understandings of the traditions, and might stimulate more dialogue.

Tradition Eight: Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.

- 1. Is my own behavior accurately described by the Traditions? If not, what needs changing?
- 2. When I chafe about any particular Tradition, do I realize how it affects others?
- 3. Do I sometimes try to get some reward—even if not money—for my personal AA efforts?
- 4. Do I try to sound in AA like an expert on alcoholism? On recovery? On medicine? On sociology? On AA itself? On psychology? On spiritual matters? Or, heaven help me, even on humility?
- 5. Do I make an effort to understand what AA employees do? What workers in other alcoholism agencies do? Can I distinguish clearly among them?
- 6. In my own AA life, have I any experiences which illustrate the wisdom of this Tradition?
- 7. Have I paid enough attention to the book Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions? To the pamphlet, AA Tradition—How It Developed?

Aug 8, 1879 - Dr. Bob born in St. Johnsbury, VT.



I've heard in meetings from time to time, and in reading the Big Book, that self-centeredness is the root of my problems; something that I continue to work on overcoming every day. Every once in a while, the Daily Reflection brings this up in the readings. It's these gentle reminders which help keep me focused on ways to overcome my self-centeredness and that selfishness which has plagued me for a long, long time. There are occasions where I lose awareness of myself and allow that self-centeredness to emerge once again and I become miserable, and not nice to be around.

One Thursday, I was having a good day at work, but by the end of the day I was mentally drained and just wanted to get home. Nothing can aggravate me more than a bad traffic day, and it was that kind of traffic day on Thursday. I thought I could outsmart the other drivers stuck in the jam by going around it, which kind of worked; but then I found myself in another jam further down the road. My original instinct told me to go a different way home, but my thoughts told me otherwise. So, I inched down the interstate in the second jam, absorbed in my self-centeredness all the while telling myself 'I'm not going to a meeting tonight.' I made it home and after a bit, decided I better go to a meeting. After the meeting, I felt better. I began to reflect

after the meeting, that evening, and through the next day as to why this happens every once in a while.

Then something comes along on self-centeredness in the Daily Reflection readings; not all in the same reading, but in two different readings. The Thought for the Day (TFTD) on July 23, 2021, talked about the 'inward peace that comes from trust in God' and that 'no person has the power to disturb that inner peace, but you must be careful to not let in the worlds worries and distractions'.

The next day's TFTD talked about 'By practicing the A.A. principles we keep the dike strong in repair. We spot any weakness or crack in that dike and make the necessary repairs before any damage is done.' I began to think about these two readings, along with the Daily Reflection on self-centeredness. I soon realized that I was allowing this outside situation and distraction of something I had no control of (traffic) to disturb my inner peace. When my inner peace was disturbed, my selfcenteredness took control and started running amok. With my self-centeredness in control, it became the hole in the dike, and if I didn't repair it, other emotions and reactions would start to make that hole bigger. But I couldn't repair it alone, I needed God's help. So, I asked for His help.

I've grown quite fond of this inner peace A.A. has guided me towards. It is now part of my maintenance to be aware of those persons or situations that I have no control over, to not let those affect my inner peace. I now carry this thought with me daily, "no person or situation has the power to disturb my inner peace."
