Today, freedom is to be a vessel for God; to do His will through me. To be able to go to meetings, and learn openly and willingly; to be able to honestly share. The freedom to have sobriety, is the most important aspect of my life besides my relationship with my higher power.

God has given me back my freedom today to join my fellow AA's on the broad highway and everyday, to look within for my higher power and embrace him. I choose to use my freedom to be part of AA, and to do His will as He sees fit. I don't know about most AAers, but for me PTSD and anxiety also play a part in my life. To be totally free of the bondage of self and alcohol is such a blessing. I am eternally grateful to God, my Sponsor, AA, and my family for allowing me true freedom to be a part of this life again. **-Shell**

Recent meeting changes



Results of June 2021 web poll

In June, we asked our website and newsletter readers to participate in a webpoll regarding how helpful the Zoom meetings were to their sobriety. Participants of this poll went to the D18 website and could participate in the poll from 6/8/21-7/3/21.

Out of 13 total responses, one person (7.7%) found Zoom meetings not helpful. Zero people (0%) found Zoom meetings somewhat helpful. Three people (23. 1%) found Zoom meetings helpful. Four people found Zoom meetings very helpful (30.8%), while

five people found Zoom meetings extremely helpful (38.5%). The results of this poll suggest that the majority of people participating found meetings Zoom were helpful to their sobriety during the pandemic. Thank you to all those that participated!


